

Sister of missing woman still searching for answers

It has been two and a half years since her sister has gone missing, and Jodie Oakley is still looking for answers.

"I think it's spineless to take someone else's life," says Jodie. "To feel the need to take a life and not have the backbone to say they actually did it."

On August 2 of 2006, Jodie's sister, Julie Oakley-Parker went missing from Willow Street, last seen in the company of a family member, says Jodie.

Jodie says that as friends, family and community members, we must ask questions and get answers.

"We just want to find her body," says Jodie.

"Then we can work to find the person responsible."

Jodie says that in addition to Julie missing her own children growing up, Julie has nieces and nephews that she's never met.

"Julie deserves better. We all do," stated Jodie on a poster she passed out last week to people on the street. "No one has the right just to erase someone else's life."

Jodie is also calling on anyone who knew Julie to take a polygraph test so they can be eliminated from the suspect list. She
