

Walk4Justice to pass through Quesnel

In an effort to bring action from the investigative, judicial and government bodies regarding unsolved cases of missing and murdered women and children over the last 10 years, the Walk4Justice is trekking from Vancouver to Terrace and Prince Rupert, passing through Quesnel June 6 – 8.

The public is invited to share the time these committed women spend in Quesnel or join them on their continued walk north.

Last year, Walk4Justice marched from Vancouver to Ottawa to raise awareness and demand a public/government response to the many missing and murdered

women across Canada.

This year the march is culminating in Terrace at a symposium on Aboriginal Day.

Walk4Justice is supported by the Union of BC Indian Chiefs, First Nations Summit, Assembly of First Nations and several other unions and associations.

But most importantly, the effort needs to be supported by the Canadian people, Gladys Radek said.
